Dear NE-501 (MACCH) HUD Continuum of Care grantees, members and stakeholders:

The below is an important notice regarding the FY 2022 CoC NOFO Competition.

This letter summarizes the list of projects that have been accepted by the CoC and will be included in the NE-501 (MACCH) CoC 2022 Project Priority List for funding. This includes renewal projects, renewal projects that have been partially reallocated and new projects that will be submitted. Also listed are the renewal projects that have been reallocated and applicants for new projects that were not accepted for inclusion in the CoC Application. Please note that all projects that are being fully or partially reallocated have been informed of the reallocation prior to the distribution of this email.

RENEWAL PROJECTS

The following renewal projects have been accepted by the CoC and will be ranked on the Renewal Priority Listing submitted to HUD. Each of these projects will be submitted at the full Annual Renewal Amount, as indicated on the CoC's 2022 Grant Inventory Worksheet:

NEW PROJECTS

The CoC received **3** new project applications totaling **\$596,192** in funding. The CoC had a total of **\$258,332** in funding to award from the CoC Bonus, **\$170,020** in funding to award from reallocation, and **\$441,410** in funding to award from the DV Bonus.

The following new projects have been accepted for inclusion on the New Project Priority List for CoC Bonus and/or reallocated funding and will be ranked on the CoC'S New Project Priority List:
